The Wickenburg High School English Department will award a \$5,000 scholarship (or five \$1,000 awards) to a deserving graduate/s who exemplify the work ethic, character and goals to further their education via four-year university, junior/community college or trade/vocational school.

Your teachers will decide who gets it! EVERY single WHS student has a chance at this money because to graduate, you all have had to take and pass four years of English. Go Wranglers!

Of course, you have to write a **one-page essay**, it's English but it doesn't have to be formal as long as you know "a lot" is two words and promise never, ever to make that misspelling! The Dragon Lady in her dungeon (basement) classroom would have drawn multiple red circles around that faux pas had you made that mistake back in the '70s and '80s. This fund is proof that if you work hard, even as "just a school teacher" you can give back to your community, realize your dreams and have lots of adventures. Did you know Bette Vote taught a year in Dubai? The kids were brought to school in limousines and had servants standing at the back of the room. BV taught them all about what it is to be an American student.

Bette Vote was a WHS English teacher, the one who started *Saddlebag Magazine*, a Columbia Press Association Award winning, 11-year student-produced community magazine. She did yearbook, mimeographed *The Wrangler Round Up* school newspaper, taught photography and built a dark room. She started the Mat Maids for our Wrangler Wrestlers and as a department, they developed an English mini course system that modeled college and gave us Wranglers a leg up on our futures and had cool classes like "Poetry in Music" in addition to grammar, literature and all the requirements.

"...she forced me to become better than I was in high school, which was what I most assuredly needed to become the English teacher I am today," wrote Adrian O, alum.
